We hope you will enjoy your virtual presentation.




2. I have 2 younger siblings – a sister and a brother.


Rules and Responsibilities

RE: *Judaism/ Mary & The Christmas story*


Computing: *Carry out research on the impact of the Roman Empire on Britain*

What will I need to do for homework?


- You will receive one piece of maths and one piece of English (usually grammar or punctuation) per week.
